Learning to Create Justice

People often ask, "What does it look like to teach elementary students about sustainability?" One way to conceptualize this is that at the Sustainability Academy, students learn to create justice. In age appropriate ways economic, social and environmental justice are explored throughout the grade levels.

Economic Justice: First graders learn about local resources and products, such as the maple sugaring process and industry. Second grade ties the math study of money in with learning about local credit unions and the opportunities they afford people. Fifth graders study business, then run a fall and spring farmer's market, investing profits into community revitalization projects. Through our school gardens, students of all ages learn to grow their own food.

<u>Social Justice</u>: In kindergarten and first grade students learn to care for themselves so that they are later able to recognize and care for the needs of others. Self-regulation techniques and conflict resolution strategies are explicitly taught and practiced in the primary grades. Second graders explore the cultural diversity of Burlington through investigating businesses in the Old North End. Third and fourth graders analyze strengths and opportunities in their neighborhood through the Healthy Neighborhoods, Healthy Kids curriculum. Fifth graders study current issues of injustice and build awareness that by honoring diversity, we can support prosperity for all. Additionally, at SA we promote student voice in decision making, as practiced through our student leadership council.

<u>Environmental Justice</u>: Kindergarteners and first graders spend time making connections to the natural world during their weekly outdoor classroom programs. Once we encourage in our students a love for nature, students
