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# Lice!

It's the four letter word that strikes fear in the hearts of families and caregivers. We are well into hat wearing season and have seen an increase in cases of lice recently. It seems like a good time to send out some reminders and information about lice.

- Your School Nurse is here as a resource to you and can provide information and help with any questions you might have about lice treatment or identification
- It's the parent's responsibility to regularly check their child's hair for lice. According to BSD policy, found on page 18 of the school calendar "Parents should check their young children's head once a week, and especially before returning to school after vacations."
- The School Nurses do not routinely check students heads for lice or check entire classrooms. If we do find lice in your child's hair we will notify you right away.
- Students are **not** excluded from school it they have lice. Although, if lice are found, it is very important to treat them as soon as possible.
