

News From the 3/4 Grade Team

As the days are getting longer again, the 3 / 4 Team has been very busy. We have just finished our unit on biographies, focusing on changemakers in our world. The students learned about a diverse group of people, all of whom demonstrated great perseverance and dedication to their cause, and then wrote their own reports about these people. They focused on events in their lives that showed how they changed the world and what lessons we can learn from them. Each student also chose a quote that they felt best demonstrated the person's ideas and impact on the world around them. To illustrate these change makers, each student created a portrait of their person, using canvases with acrylic and watercolors. These reports and portraits can be seen on display in the second floor hallway. As a culmination of their hard work, we invited families and friends to join us at an end-of-day celebration of learning to see all of the work and to share some food and drinks.





We are now in the middle of our Urban Animals unit, where the students are learning about the different animals we have living right here in Burlington, and how the animals and humans interact with and impact each other. Students will be working towards creating a google slideshow presenting their learning about an urban animal of their choice. 

Parking Lot Expectations



School parking lots can be incredibly busy places in the morning when children arrive and in the afternoon when children are dismissed.

Safety is a primary concern of the school staff, but it requires everyone's participation. Please be patient, respectful, and courteous to each other while picking up and dropping off your student(s) to and from school.

By being a positive role model you can help our students learn safe procedures. Please review the following expectations below.

- Students should not be walking in or through the parking lot (blacktop), unless accompanied by an adult.
- All students and adults should follow the directions of the Crossing Guards, Student Safety Patrol, and SA Staff.
- Drivers should not go faster than 10 MPH in the parking lot.
- Refrain from using cell phones while in the school zone, especially while dropping off or picking up your children.
- If a child is not able to get out of the vehicle by themselves, the driver must park and walk the child to the sidewalk.
- Bicycles and scooters must be walked on school property at all times.

- There is no supervision on the playground until

Chinese New Year



Chinese New Year in 2019 was on **Tuesday**, **the 5th of February**. According to the Chinese 12-year animal zodiac cycle, the Chinese year beginning in 2019 is the year of the **Pig**. Each Chinese zodiac year begins on Chinese New Year's Day.

Chinese New Year is a traditional and very important Chinese holiday. It was originally a festival to honor ancestors as well as holy or sacred beings. It is also known as the Spring Festival, which is the literal translation from the Chinese name. It is also referred to as the Lunar New Year because the Chinese calendar is lunisolar. A lunisolar calendar uses both the moon phase and the solar year. Chinese New Year is the longest festival in the Chinese calendar.
